

New Grantees



KFF STEM Scholarship

Under KFF's president Jurate Kazickas' initiative \$50, 000 have been allocated to support talented Lithuanian citizens accepted into accredited undergraduate or graduate programs in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) abroad.

A committee composed of Kazickas family members and an academic expert Dr. Saulius Diliunas selected six scholarship recipients:

Engagement with LT Community

The major highlight of fostering community connections was the **Partner Appreciation and Networking Event**. The focus of the evening was gratitude to partners and networking. The official program was composed of:

- A panel discussion "Innovative Philanthropy" moderated by KFF's Vilnius Office Executive Director Domante Greifenbergeryte. The panelists were: Kiki Kazickas on KFF's behalf, Sergej Artemiuk, "Acme Group", and Aiste Ulubey, "Artscape".
- Beneficiary Spotlight was given to Giedre Deveikyte, "Uncommon LT" alumna.
- Grantee Spotlight to the Lithuanian World Center.
- Musical performance was gifted by ensemble "Lietuva".













Engagement with LT Community

This year KFF staff in Lithuania:

- held and participated in over 80 meetings and visits with partners, grantees, beneficiaries and other KFF community members.
- attended over 40 events organized by partners.







We hosted 6 community building events at the Kazickas Family Residence:

- International student exchange program "ASSIST" Alumni Evening
- Youth Empowerment Reception
- "Smart-ups" Project Strategic Session
- Social Welfare Reception
- Open Door Event for Lithuanian Diaspora
- Diaspora Talent Networking Evening

Dedicating time to meet with grantees and partners as well as creating platforms for idea exchange and networking have contributed to our goal of building a stronger like-minded civic community in Lithuania.







Additional Support to Grantees

We expand our philanthropic efforts beyond financial support and provide the grantees with learning and networking opportunities. This year in addition to regular meetings and visits, we offered:

- Pitch workshop sessions to 10 grantees. They
 were organized by startup advisory "Katalista
 Ventures", and consisted of two individual sessions
 and a final meeting where the organizations had a
 chance to practice their new pitch in front of a jury.
- Tickets for 20 partners to attend the "Fundraising Summit 2024" organized by the Baltic Fundraising Hub.









Engagement with US Community

In the United States, we continue to **strengthen ties with the Lithuanian-American diaspora** and engage in efforts to address key community and diaspora issues. Some highlights of Kazickas Family and Executive Director of US Office Neila Baumiliene meetings and participation in events in the USA:

- The North American Lithuanian Business Forum in New York.
- The Lithuanian American Community Council Meeting in Dallas.
- The official unveiling ceremony of V. K. Jonynas bas-reliefs at the Lithuanian World Center.
- The Christmas morning celebration at the Alexandra Kazickas Lithuanian School in Eastern Long Island.
- The New York City Fundraiser and Community Info Event organized by the Ukrainian NGO "Kind Deeds."

In addition, a first U.S. business trip by Executive Director Domante Greifenbergeryte took place, including visits to Lithuanian-American communities and institutions in New York City, Washington DC, Chicago, Los Angeles, and Lithuanian diaspora youth summer camps "Neringa" and "Dainava".













Uncommon LT Growth

In 2024 the IT skills program fully funded by KFF "Uncommon LT" shifted in its concept and approach. Now it offers modules on a variety of AI tools practical use and development of soft skills. The goal is to bridge the digital divide between cities and rural regions in Lithuania.

Key facts:

- Two locations in Panevezys and Ukmerge. In 2025 to expand to five regions by adding Pasvalys, Birzai and Kedainiai.
- Over 30 Al skills development workshops carried out on 15 different topics.
- Target audience: teenagers, unemployed and minimum wage earners, teachers, senior citizens.
- Dedicated team behind the program are based in Panevezys and Ukmerge: leva Klungyte, Matas Meskauskas and Indromeda Jankauskiene.
- KFF staff supports the team through mentorship, strategic sessions, teambuildings and regular visits.









Independent Programs

These programs already operate as separate NGOs but remain KFF's flagship initiatives for youth empowerment and development:

Key updates from life skills development program for youth living in the regions "Youth Can":

- The program is celebrating its 10th anniversary.
- 6-day summer camp received 65 campers.
- 1-day alcohol-free youth music festival "PumpFest" in Pumpenai gathered
 6000 attendees.
- A brand new youth and community center opened in Pumpenai.
- Regular after-school activities take place in 10 locations across Lithuania.







Key updates from diaspora youth internship program "Bring Together Lithuania":

- 22 Lithuanian diaspora participants from 6 different countries joined the 7th generation of BTLT in the summer of 2024.
- A record number, over 80 applications were received.
- 3 alumni after completing their internships decided to continue working or studying in Lithuania.







Next Year Goals

In 2025, KFF will continue fulfilling the mission to create a better world for current and future generations in Lithuania and abroad. Our key focus areas will remain:

- Building community by organizing networking events that address the causes the Foundation supports, including education, support Ukraine, diaspora engagement, and more.
- Helping grantees beyond funding through capacity-building initiatives and partnerships.
- · Supporting Lithuanian society through funding the new scholarship program and the emotional health standard.
- · Promoting philanthropic values and inspiring others through media outreach and public events.

We are grateful to our community for standing with us for 26 years and enabling us to drive meaningful change across all the areas we work on. Together, we have achieved so much, and we are excited to embark on another impactful and inspiring year ahead!
